1. Transactions costs	<ul> <li>§ limit proliferation</li> <li>§ use recipient systems</li> <li>§ link aid to results</li> </ul>
2. Skills shortages	§ minimize earmarking § improve technical assistance § long-term predictable aid
3. Scarcity of good projects	<pre>§ scale up successful projects § better evaluation</pre>
4. Dutch disease	<ul> <li>§ provide long term aid</li> <li>§ use aid for imports</li> <li>§ investing in competitiveness</li> </ul>
5. Macroeconomic volatility	§ less volatile aid § more predictable aid § save temporary increases
6. Corrodes accountability	<ul> <li>suse process conditionality</li> <li>support PRSPs</li> <li>no additionality requirement</li> </ul>
7. Resource curse	<ul> <li>§ aid through budgets</li> <li>§ publish what you pay</li> <li>§ information campaigns</li> </ul>
